The year 2011 will mark the 400th anniversary of the publication of the King James Bible. Dr. Seidman will speak on a chapter in the history of its afterlife, the Jewish Publication Society's 1917 translation of the Hebrew Bible or "Tanakh" — a translation which intentionally and self consciously echoed the language and cadences of the King James Version, establishing a continuity between Jewish liturgical and biblical expression and the biblical culture that shaped the Anglophone world.
