Anderson Hall

Known as Language Hall when it opened its doors in 1906, the University of Florida renamed this historic building in 1949 after Dr. James Nesbitt Anderson, a professor of Greek and Latin, who was the first Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the first Dean of the Graduate School.

Designed by architect William A. Edwards in the collegiate gothic style, the National Register of Historic Places added Anderson Hall to its rolls in 1979. It forms the cornerstone of the University of Florida Campus Historic District.

A gift from Kenneth and Janet Keene made the restoration and renovation of Anderson Hall possible. It now houses the Departments of Political Science and Religion.
