

Map. Sites Named in Temple-Visit Poems

Liang and Chen dynasties mainly

- 1 Jiankang: 43 poems. Caotang, Chan'gang, Daaijing, Dinglin, Guangzhai, Mount Huku (a.k.a. Mt. She)—temple unnamed, Kaishan, Mingqing (1 poem dates from Sui), Qidu, Qixia, Tian'an, Tongtai, Xingye, Mount Zhong—temple unnamed
- (2) Wujun (Suzhou): 2 poems. Mount Huqiu
- (3) Mount Lu (Jiangxi): 1 poem. Donglin
- (4) Shixing (Guangzhou): 1 poem. Guangguo
- (5) Baling (Hunan): 1 poem. Temple unnamed

Northern Zhou dynasty

- 6 Chang'an (Shaanxi): 2 poems. Caotang
- (7) Puzhou (Shanxi): 2 poems. Yunju

Sui dynasty

- 8 Xiangyang (Hubei): 1 poem. Upper Fenglin
- **9** Mount Fang (Shandong): 2 poems. Lingyan

Location Uncertain

- Dacizhao Temple, poem B 28
- HumingTemple on White Horse Mountain, poem B 32
- Longqiu Precipice Retreat, poem B 25
- Tianzhong Temple, poem B 7
- Unnamed temple and place, poems A 26, B 6, B 27
