The era of globalization has had a profound impact on the commodification of human labor and on migration. An increased proportion of the world population has been assembled directly into capitalist labor markets and transnational labor regimes. This has resulted in new paths for migration and social mobility, that now bypass nation-states, and in new alignments of sovereign rule, market rationality and citizenship. How has this been experienced in Europe? How do contemporary welfare and labor regimes, citizenship rights, immigration rules, interethnic and racial structures in Europe inform the movement of people?
